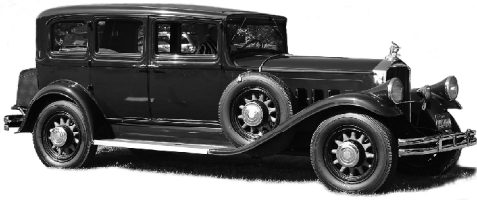

“The Motorcar Remakes America”

Thursday, May 6, 7:00pm, 2010

Please join us for this unique opportunity to hear automotive historian Sinclair Powell, and enthusiast Bill Thomas describe how the motorcar has impacted American life during the past 100-plus years. Sinclair will present an Automotive history from WWII to 1960, and Bill will continue the presentation from 1960 on.

Sinclair Powell of Ann Arbor, Michigan has been an active automotive historian for the past twenty years (prior to that he was a lawyer specializing in land use, transportation issues, urban development and related state and local government problems). He has been active in the major international organization involved with automotive history, the Society of Automotive Historians. Powell served as Vice-President of the Society in 1995-1997; and as President in 1997-1999.

Bill Thomas was born and raised in Lansing Michigan in a General Motors family. His grandfather was one of the original GM men, starting there in 1919. Bill served a four year apprenticeship at Oldsmobile in 1959, which led to his working in the Experimental Assembly Department. There, he helped build experimental engines and Motorama show cars. Bill was a hot rodder and drag racer in the 1950's and early 1960's, and was involved with the Lansing and Detroit Autorama car shows during that period.
